PRIZES:

3 points will be awarded for 1st place, 2 points for 2nd, 1 point for 3rd. Trophies are awarded to the people with the most points in Photography, Vegetables & Eggs, Fruit, Flowers, Domestic, Arts & Crafts, Woodwork & Metalwork and each Children’s age section. Certificates are awarded for 1st, 2nd and 3rd places in each class—these will be left on the tables for collection by the winners.

The overall Show Cup will go to the H&LL resident with the most points obtained in Classes 1 to 62. In the event of a tie, the entrant with the most first then second places will win. There is also an award for the family with most points in all classes.

The ‘Bill Bedford’ trophy will be awarded to the best photo entered by a child. A special shield is awarded to the best single exhibit, as judged by the Social & Community Centre Committee and a Novice’s Award to the person whose first-ever entry in a class is judged best by the Parish Council. This year’s Haversham Allotments & Gardens Society Award will go to the overall best Floral exhibit in Classes 30 to 36, as judged by the Horticultural judge.

SHOW RULES:

1. Entry Fees: Children - 20p per Entry Adults - 50p per Entry
2. Entry forms with entry fee must be in by no later than **Thursday 30th August**, to Jackie Brown, 39 The Crescent or Lesley Gilbert at Woodpecker Cottage. **N.B. No entries will be accepted on the day.**
3. All entries must be made/grown by the exhibitor, except Classes 34 to 36 and Children’s Classes 68, 73, 79 and 85.
4. This show is open to all. However the ‘Overall’ trophy will only go to a Haversham or Little Linford resident.
5. All entries must be in place by 10.45 am.
6. No entries to be removed before 4.00 pm.
7. During judging, no one other than the judges and stewards are permitted to be inside the hall.
8. Stewards may not have entries in the section of the show that they are stewarding.
9. Jams etc. must be in a 1lb/454g jar. They must not have metal lids and need to be labelled and dated.
10. Exhibitors may only exhibit one entry per class, due to limited space.
11. Previous entries are not acceptable.
12. Paintings must be hung to be exhibited.
13. Vases for flowers will not be supplied.
14. Exhibits are placed at the exhibitor’s own risk.
15. The judge’s decision is final.

PHOTOGRAPHY

Class 1 - A photograph of the theme of **Blue**.

Class 2 - A photograph of the **Floodplain Forest Nature Reserve** by the River Ouse.

Class 3 - A photograph of **Leaves**.

Class 4 - A photograph of an **Animal or Animals**.

Class 5 - An **Amusing** photograph.

Class 6 - A **Selfie**.

Class 7 - A photograph of any type of **Sporting Event**.

Class 8 - A photograph on the theme of **Peace**, commemorating the end of WWI.

Class 9 - A photograph of **Rocks**.

Unless otherwise specified above, photographs can be any size up to A4, may be colour or black & white and may be mounted on card but not framed.

VEGETABLES

Class 10 - 4 carrots with a minimum of 3" tops

Class 11 - A plate of 4 runner beans

Class 12 - A plate of 4 French beans

Class 13 - A mis-shaped or ugly vegetable

Class 14 - Group of 3 equal sized white potatoes

Class 15 - Group of 3 equal sized coloured potatoes

Class 16 - A plate of 4 tomatoes

Class 17 - A plate of 4 cherry tomatoes

Class 18 - 3 beetroots with tops

Class 19 - Cucumber - indoor grown

Class 20 - 4 onions (equal size and colour)

Class 21 - A plate of 6 Shallots

Class 22 - Heaviest Marrow

Class 23 - A mixed basket of vegetables (1 of each of 6 varieties of Vegetables, parsley garnish allowed, maximum 24"/60cm diameter)

Class 24 - Salad Bowl (minimum of 4 varieties of salad items, maximum 18"/45cm diameter)

Where presenting items on a plate, please use a paper plate.

FRUIT

Class 25 - A plate of 4 cooking apples of equal size

Class 26 - A plate of 4 dessert apples of equal size

Class 27 - A plate of 3 pears

Class 28 - A plate of 4 plums

Class 29 - A plate of a single variety of fruit not listed above with a minimum of 3 and maximum of 5 examples.

Where presenting items on a plate, please use a paper plate.

FLOWERS

Class 30 - A single Rose in a vase

Class 31 - 3 Dahlias in a vase (any variety—mix and match)

Class 32 - A Pot Plant—foliage or flowering, indoor or outdoor (one pot not to exceed 8"/20cm diameter)

Class 33 - An arrangement of foliage, fruit and/or berries but without flowers

Class 34 - A floral arrangement commemorating the end of WWI, 2'6"/75cm maximum width. Natural plant material to predominate but a little artificial material allowed.

Class 35 - A Tussie Mussie (a nosegay carried in times past to ward off nasty smells!) .

Class 36 - A small floral arrangement for the Afternoon Tea table (maximum 6"/15cm wide and 9"/23cm high)

DOMESTIC

Class 37 - A 1lb (454gm) jar of any flavour of Jam

Class 38 - A 1lb (454gm) jar of Marmalade

Class 39 - A 1lb (454gm) jar of Lemon Curd

Class 40 - A 1lb (454gm) jar of Chutney

Class 41 - A Cheese Scone Round - recipe supplied *

Class 42 - A round of shortbread—own recipe

Class 43 - An apple pie - recipe supplied *

Class 44 - 4 savoury tartlets - own recipe

Class 45 - 4 white bread rolls - own recipe

Class 46 - A Victoria sponge - recipe supplied *

Class 47 - A family fruit cake - recipe supplied *

Class 48 - *open only to novices in the domestic classes #* - a plate of 4 fruit scones - recipe supplied *

Class 49 - *open to men only!* A Bedfordshire (or Bucks) Clanger - a pasty with savoury filling at one end and sweet at the other - own recipe.

Class 54 - A hand-made cushion - maximum 10"/25cm square

Class 55 - Any other item not included in the above classes

Class 56 - A painting of fruit, in any medium

Class 57 - Any other painting, in any medium

Class 58 - An item of wood turning

Class 59 - An item made from metal

Class 60 - An item of homemade jewellery

Class 61 - An item in wood

Class 62 - A miniature scarecrow for the garden (maximum 18"/45cm wide and 24"/60cm high), made from recycled materials

Class 63 - A decorated gingerbread man (the biscuit does not have to be homemade)

Class 64 - A piece of edible jewellery
